

MOUNT LAUREL TOWNSHIP COUNCIL PASSES BUDGET WITH NO MUNICIPAL TAX INCREASE

Mount Laurel, NJ --- The Mount Laurel Township Council has passed a budget for Fiscal Year 2022 with no municipal tax increase. As shown below, residents can expect their municipal taxes to make up approximately 12% of their total tax bill. This is the third consecutive year that there has been a zero tax increase to Mount Laurel residents.

Township Council and management has worked diligently to make sure there are no cuts to public services.
